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#### Redemption Hill,

One year ago, we started casting the vision that God is calling us to Dwell: An Enduring & Faithful Presence. After over a decade of prayerfully working to deepen our roots in this city so that we can see lasting and sustained fruitfulness in ministry, and a year of prayerful discernment, we are looking ahead to the next decade of ministry and beyond. We believe that finding a place that Redemption Hill can call home, where we can establish a lasting presence, will enable us to be a hub for ministry and a rooted presence for the good of our city.

Our Primary Goal this year was 100% engagement. I have been amazed to see how people have stepped up in our church! New CG Leaders have been commissioned, as long-timers have stayed faithful. People have stepped up to serve across every ministry team. In the new year, that goal is all the more important. If we are going to be effective in the ministry we talk about doing, it will take every one of us bringing our gifts to the table.

We set a high target for our Secondary Goal – to raise \$4 million over two years for ongoing ministry as mission as well as savings toward a future home for RHC. In March we saw commitments for \$2.6 million – 65% of that goal! We are on track for an estimated \$2.4 million over two years, so we have \$1.6 million left to raise to hit our goal. I hope you will join me and the rest of the leadership team here at RHC in giving and in praying for our continued progress to hit the goal of \$4 million within two years.

Many of you are on pace with what you committed, some of you have already given over and above the commitment, and some of you have the opportunity to start fulfilling your commitment now as we start a new year. Some of you might have heard about Dwell, but are new to RHC within the past year and haven't made a commitment yet. Wherever you are, thank you for investing into our church.

We are now about 10 months into this two-year discipleship journey. I hope that your relationship with Jesus has been strengthened along the way. The start of a new year brings a renewed focus for us all, and this is a great time to revisit our church's vision to Dwell. Our site, Dwell.redemptionhilldc.org, has resources, updates, FAQs, and giving available.

I believe that Redemption Hill's best and most fruitful days are ahead, and that God has called us to this place at this time. I want to be part of building something that will last and outlive all of us.

#### **RAISE \$4 MILLION**




As we all take personal journeys in generosity, we are hopeful that it will provide the resources we need to expand gospel ministry in our city and open the door to the possiblity of establishing a long-term home for Redemption Hill Church.

#### MINISTRY & MISSION | \$2M

We will continue to glorify God through gospel-centered worship, gospel-shaped community, and gospel-driven work in our city. We will continue to be shaped by gracious hospitality, unified diveristy, and empowered members as we work to reach and reflect DC. \$1.8m is needed for our operations and ministry over the next two years. We will invest \$200k outside of Redemption Hill to invest into church plants across the nation and the world. Redemption Hill will also work to establish new partnerships and expand the current residency program to help train church planters.

#### **DWELLING PLACE | \$2M**

For Redemption Hill to have a chance to have a permanent home, we will need to have enough for a down payment and initial costs. \$2M will go toward the goal of giving our church a home to Dwell, as An Enduring and Faithful Presence and gospel outpost – a legacy that will outlive us all. Exceeding this goal will only help toward that goal.

#### **SUNDAYS**

Redemption Hill is An Enduring & Faithful Presence, gathering to worship each Sunday for over 12 years now. We have grown on Sundays.

#### KIDS AND YOUTH

Our youngest members are thriving. Kids Worship has continued to grow as we work to make the gospel clear to the youngest among us. We also have a fresh developing Youth Ministry.

#### COMMUNITY GROUPS

CGs continue to be the primary means of connection and discipleship at RHC. Our CGs have faithfully filled those needs and we are excited to see freshness and life breathed into and come through our CGs in the coming year.


#### CHURCH PLANTING

Redemption Hill is a key ministry partner for two church plants in other global capitals. We have increased our investment into Village Church South Belfast in Northern Ireland and to Doxa, Iglesia Cristiana, in Mexico City.

We also helped launch a new church plant in Harrisburg, PA. Ben Bechtel completed a church planting residency at RHC and launched Midtown Community Church in the fall of 2023.



#### **NEW COMMITMENT**

You're new to RHC and are wondering, "What is Dwell? How do I become part of it?" Dwell is the theme for all of our giving from March 2023 through March 2025. Every dollar given to Redemption Hill during these two years is part of Dwell. It's for anyone who would call Fellowship Denver home. If you've joined us sometime in the past year, consider making a new 12-month generosity commitment to First to the Lord.

#### FINISH STRONG

Many of you made a commitment last March. For some, this past year has brought more challenges than you expected, or as you went to a new level of generosity, you're still adjusting your lifestyle to it. Or maybe you experienced a job loss or unexpected financial expenses. Regardless of the reason, the midpoint of the journey is a gut-check to keep going and finish strong. That's the whole point of Dwell - to stay engaged with God in real time, not just living off last year's lessons. Finishing strong is how you're staying engaged. We are proud of you and stand with you.

#### **INCREASE**

Some of us made a commitment last year, and it's possible we've had an increase in faith or finances. It's not that keeping our commitment has been easy, but you might be sensing that the Lord is inviting you to take an additional step and increase your generosity by increasing your commitment. Consider asking yourself some questions like: Am I still letting my giving drive my spending and saving? Is my heart still engaged with my giving? Does my generosity still say, "The Lord is first?" Pray and ask if he's inviting you into a new step of faith with an increased commitment.



# Dwell: An Enduring 8 Faithful Presence

#### JEREMIAH 29:4-14

4 "Thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel, to all the exiles whom I have sent into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon: 5 Build houses and live in them; plant gardens and eat their produce. 6 Take wives and have sons and daughters; take wives for your sons, and give your daughters in marriage, that they may bear sons and daughters; multiply there, and do not decrease. 7 But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare. 8 For thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel: Do not let your prophets and your diviners who are among you deceive you, and do not listen to the dreams that they dream,[a] 9 for it is a lie that they are prophesying to you in my name; I did not send them, declares the Lord.

10 "For thus says the Lord: When seventy years are completed for Babylon, I will visit you, and I will fulfill to you my promise and bring you back to this place. 11 For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for welfare[b] and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope. 12 Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will hear you. 13 You will seek me and find me, when you seek me with all your heart. 14 I will be found by you, declares the Lord, and I will restore your fortunes and gather you from all the nations and all the places where I have driven you, declares the Lord, and I will bring you back to the place from which I sent you into exile.

3 I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, 4 always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, 5 because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now. 6 And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ. 7 It is right for me to feel this way about you all, because I hold you in my heart, for you are all partakers with me of grace,[a] both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel. 8 For God is my witness, how I yearn for you all with the affection of Christ Jesus. 9 And it is my prayer that your love may abound more and more, with knowledge and all discernment, 10 so that you may approve what is excellent, and so be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, 11 filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ, to the glory and praise of God.

1.	Whose generosity inspires you? What are some ways we can inspire
	one another in generosity?

2. Read 2 Corinthians 8:2-5. What are some characteristics of the Macedonians' overflowing generosity? What are some of your hesitations or fears of being generous with your giving?

3. 2 Corinthians 8:5 says the Macedonians, "gave themselves first to the Lord". What are you tempted to give yourself to first when thinking about your generosity? How can you give yourself first to the Lord?

#### WEEK 2 | Influence

4. Read 2 Corinthians 8:9. What are some ways that true wealth in Christ calms our fears about excelling in generosity and promotes generosity?

5. When I think about the legacy I want to leave with my life, how would people characterize how I gave? Paul shares that the Macedonians gave beyond their ability and entirely on their own accord, urgently pleading for teh privilege to give. Would someone characterize my giving in that way after I'm gone from this earth?

# Lifestyle

#### COLOSSIANS 1:15-23

15 He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. 16 For by[a] him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him and for him. 17 And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together. 18 And he is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything he might be preeminent. 19 For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, 20 and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross.

21 And you, who once were alienated and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, 22 he has now reconciled in his body of flesh by his death, in order to present you holy and blameless and above reproach before him, 23 if indeed you continue in the faith, stable and steadfast, not shifting from the hope of the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed in all creation[b] under heaven, and of which I, Paul, became a minister.

#### **WEEK 3** | Lifestyle

1.	Read 2 Corinthians 8:10-11. Paul challenged the Corinthians to plan ahead in order to fulfill their plans and commitments. How do Paul's words inspire you to match your desires with generous action? Have you ever felt tempted to bail out on a commitment you made?
2.	How is generosity measured according to 2 Corinthians 8:12? How does this impact your perspective on your own heart and your approach to generosity?
3.	2 Corinthians 8:13-15 speaks of needs being abundantly met. When have your needs been met in surprising ways? When have you been able to meet people's needs?

#### WEEK 3 | Lifestyle

4. Read 2 Corinthians 8:16-24. Why does Paul make such a strong emphasis on Titus' ministry resume? How can a church ensure that people have confidence in how money is used?

5. Reflect on question #1. What plan is God asking you to make as part of Redemption Hill?

# Legacy

#### 2 CORINTHIANS 8:1-9

We want you to know, brothers,[a] about the grace of God that has been given among the churches of Macedonia, 2 for in a severe test of affliction, their abundance of joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of generosity on their part. 3 For they gave according to their means, as I can testify, and beyond their means, of their own accord, 4 begging us earnestly for the favor[b] of taking part in the relief of the saints— 5 and this, not as we expected, but they gave themselves first to the Lord and then by the will of God to us. 6 Accordingly, we urged Titus that as he had started, so he should complete among you this act of grace. 7 But as you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in all earnestness, and in our love for you[c]—see that you excel in this act of grace also.

8 I say this not as a command, but to prove by the earnestness of others that your love also is genuine. 9 For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you by his poverty might become rich.

#### **WEEK 4** | Legacy

1. Paul shares about the evangelistic power that exists when we give accompanied by our confession of the gospel of Christ – that other people will see why we give and will praise God because of it. Do I feel I give in this way – in a way that is driven by my confession of the gospel of Christ? Or is my giving driven by other things, potentially even things that are not from God? If so, what are those things?

2. Read 2 Corinthians 9:1-5. Paul thinks it unnecessary to write to the Corinthians about generous giving yet does so anyway, why? How does Paul's delicate, encouraging approach inspire you to give bountifully?

3. Read 2 Corinthians 9:6-8. What is the reward promised by God to those who give bountifully? What excites you about this reward for bountiful givers?

#### WEEK 4 | Legacy

4. This passage was written within the context an offering that was being received for some of the poorer churches in Jerusalem. However, Paul is emphasizing that this giving is not just meeting the needs of those communities but that it is also overflowing in many expressions of thanks to God. Do I see my giving in that way? How might God be calling me to refocus the impact of my giving as I think about why and how I give?

5. Why does God love a cheerful giver? Why is cheerful giving better than giving under compulsion? What will help you be a more cheerful giver?

### **CONFESS TO GOD...**

- Any reluctance or compulsion you might feel to give.
- Any barriers to bountiful giving that you're experiencing.

### THANK GOD...

For abundant provision so that we can afford to be generous again and again and again.

- To help you give bountifully and joyfully.
- To make every grace abound to you so that you can abound in every good work.
- To supply you abundantly as you give so that you can joyfully give even more.



# Giving God's Way

#### **2 CORINTHIANS 8:10-24**

10 And in this matter I give my judgment: this benefits you, who a year ago started not only to do this work but also to desire to do it. 11 So now finish doing it as well, so that your readiness in desiring it may be matched by your completing it out of what you have. 12 For if the readiness is there, it is acceptable according to what a person has, not according to what he does not have. 13 For I do not mean that others should be eased and you burdened, but that as a matter of fairness 14 your abundance at the present time should supply their need, so that their abundance may supply your need, that there may be fairness. 15 As it is written, "Whoever gathered much had nothing left over, and whoever gathered little had no lack."

16 But thanks be to God, who put into the heart of Titus the same earnest care I have for you. 17 For he not only accepted our appeal, but being himself very earnest he is going[a] to you of his own accord. 18 With him we are sending[b] the brother who is famous among all the churches for his preaching of the gospel. 19 And not only that, but he has been appointed by the churches to travel with us as we carry out this act of grace that is being ministered by us, for the glory of the Lord himself and to show our good will. 20 We take this course so that no one should blame us about this generous gift that is being administered by us, 21 for we aim at what is honorable not only in the Lord's sight but also in the sight of man. 22 And with them we are sending our brother whom we have often tested and found earnest in many matters, but who is now more earnest than ever because of his great confidence in you. 23 As for Titus, he is my partner and fellow worker for your benefit. And as for our brothers, they are messengers[c] of the churches, the glory of Christ. 24 So give proof before the churches of your love and of our boasting about you to these men.

### **WEEK 5** | Giving God's Way

1.	This passage teaches that one purpose of God's provision is that we might be more generous. In light of that, how has God been preparing you for increasing generosity? How have you been responding?
2.	What two things does our generous giving accomplish? How does that stir up enthusiasm and motivation as you consider your own generous giving?
3.	What are some ways that the generosity of God's people can lead others to give thanks to God? How has the generosity of others

led you to thank God in the past?

### WEEK 5 | Giving God's Way

4. What is God's inexpressible gift? What impact has this gift had on your generosity?

5. Reserve the rest of the night for reflection, praise, and thanksgiving to God in response to 2 Corinthians 9:11-15.

#### 2 CORINTHIANS 9:1-15

Now it is superfluous for me to write to you about the ministry for the saints, 2 for I know your readiness, of which I boast about you to the people of Macedonia, saying that Achaia has been ready since last year. And your zeal has stirred up most of them. 3 But I am sending[a] the brothers so that our boasting about you may not prove empty in this matter, so that you may be ready, as I said you would be. 4 Otherwise, if some Macedonians come with me and find that you are not ready, we would be humiliated—to say nothing of you—for being so confident. 5 So I thought it necessary to urge the brothers to go on ahead to you and arrange in advance for the gift[b] you have promised, so that it may be ready as a willing gift, not as an exaction.[c]

6 The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully[d] will also reap bountifully. 7 Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. 8 And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency[e] in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work. 9 As it is written,

"He has distributed freely, he has given to the poor; his righteousness endures forever."

10 He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness. 11 You will be enriched in every way to be generous in every way, which through us will produce thanksgiving to God. 12 For the ministry of this service is not only supplying the needs of the saints but is also overflowing in many thanksgivings to God. 13 By their approval of this service, they[f] will glorify God because of your submission that comes from your confession of the gospel of Christ, and the generosity of your contribution for them and for all others, 14 while they long for you and pray for you, because of the surpassing grace of God upon you. 15 Thanks be to God for his inexpressible gift!

### WEEK 6 | Generosity

1.	Have you ever been surprised by God's generosity? When have you experienced God's generous provision in your life?
2.	Read 2 Corinthians 9:1-5. Paul thinks it unnecessary to write to the Corinthians about generous giving yet does so anyway, why? How does Paul's delicate, encouraging approach inspire you to give bountifully?
3.	Read 2 Corinthians 9:6-8. What is the reward promised by God to those who give bountifully? What excites you about this reward for bountiful givers?

### **WEEK 6** | Generosity

4. How does 2 Corinthians 9:6-8 differ from the false prosperity gospel which encourages Christians to give so that they can get?

5. Why does God love a cheerful giver? Why is cheerful giving better than giving under compulsion? What will help you be a more cheerful giver?

- Any reluctance or compulsion you might feel to give.
- Any barriers to bountiful giving that you're experiencing.

### THANK GOD...

For abundant provision so that we can afford to be generous again and again and again.

- ► To help you give bountifully and joyfully.
- To make every grace abound to you so that you can abound in every good work.
- To supply you abundantly as you give so that you can joyfully give even more.



## Commitment

#### **ROMANS 12:1-8**

I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. 2 Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.

3 For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. 4 For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, 5 so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. 6 Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; 7 if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; 8 the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness.

### **WEEK 7** | Commitment

1. This is pretty clear that worship is an all of life endeavor, not just singing on Sundays. What rhythms and patterns do you have that are helping you break the molds that our world tries to press you into, so that you can be formed more fully into the image of Jesus? What would you like to develop more?

2. Re-read verses 3-8. The Body of Christ is the church, and each of us is a member of that body. How have you seen other people's gifts and talents make an impact in the church? In your own life?

### **WEEK 7** | Commitment

3. We often see others and think they have great faith. Sometimes we need to imagine for our own lives what we might do if we did have that kind of faith, and then do it! Our faith will follow as we put ourselves in position to be more dependent on the Christ and on the Spirit of God. When you look at your own life, how do you think God has gifted you to be part of the health and building up of His church?

4. As we prepare our hearts for Commitment Sunday, spend time praying and reflecting on this passage, considering what God is stirring in your own heart. Whether time, talent, or treasure, what is God asking you to commit to invest at this time in this place?



### **PRAISE GOD...**

- For His mercy, which is new every morning (Lam. 3:22-23).
- For allowing us to be part of His work.

### **CONFESS TO GOD...**

Any fear or hesitation that has kept you from investing yourself more fully.

### THANK GOD...

- For the ways that other people's gifts have ministered to you.
- That different people have different gifts, and that He has a purpose for you.

- For clarity on how He has gifted you for this moment.
- For the faith to make a commitment and the endurance to fulfill it.

What a power the believers in Christ will be in this world, where such multitudes are hateful and hating one another, when they all come to abound in deep, pure, fervent love to God and to their neighbors! How they will be stimulated to labor and give and pray for the gathering of every creature in the world into the fold of Christ when they love God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, "with all their heart, and soul, and might, and mind, and strength," and really and truly love their neighbor as themselves!
